

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS INTERNATIONAL ACADEMIC EXCHANGE PROGRAM (INCOMING) Universidad Interamericana

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Applicants must have successfully completed the first four (4) semesters of their undergraduate degree program.
2. Submit an official academic transcript with a minimum GPA equivalent to 8.5 / 10 under the Mexican grading system or its equivalent in the home country, corresponding to the immediately preceding academic term. Applications from students with a lower GPA will not be accepted under any circumstances.
3. Complete and submit the Universidad Interamericana Mobility Application Form.
4. Complete and submit the Course Equivalency / Credit Transfer Form.
5. Provide two (2) letters of recommendation issued by faculty members from the home institution.
6. Submit a Statement of Purpose explaining the applicant's interest in studying in Puebla and at Universidad Interamericana.
7. Submit a copy of a valid passport with a minimum validity of one (1) year.
8. Submit a Commitment Letter for the purchase of major medical insurance with international coverage. Once accepted, students must purchase an insurance policy valid throughout Mexico, including the State of Puebla, and submit proof of coverage.

10. To apply for Interamericana housing "RESIDE INTER", you must submit an additional letter stating your reasons. This will allow us to forward your application to the appropriate department to process the payments.

Application deadline: Friday, October 16, 2026.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Final selection results will be issued by the Exchange Coordination Office and are final and non-appealable.
2. Once admitted to Universidad Interamericana, attendance at the Orientation Session upon arrival in Puebla is mandatory.

3. In all cases, the exchange period shall be governed by the terms and conditions established in the cooperation agreement signed between Universidad Interamericana and the student's home institution.
4. Exchange students must comply with all academic, administrative, and financial requirements established by their home institution (payments, document submission deadlines, institutional regulations, etc.).

STUDENT COMMITMENTS

Selected and admitted students must:

1. Cover all round-trip transportation costs (air and/or ground).
2. Cover all living expenses, including accommodation, meals, and local transportation, in accordance with the requirements of each mobility program.
3. If required, obtain the appropriate student exchange visa, assuming all associated costs and complying with the corresponding immigration requirements. Students are advised to verify whether their nationality requires a visa for stays of less than six (6) months in Mexico and to consult the Mexican consulate in their country regarding applicable requirements.
4. Enroll in a minimum academic load of three (3) courses that are compatible and equivalent to their home degree program, in accordance with the schedule and academic regulations established by the host university. Students are encouraged to review the annexes of the active agreement with their home institution or request the relevant documentation from Universidad Interamericana at: j.sanchez@lainter.edu.mx

NOTES

1. Incomplete or late applications will not be processed.
2. If, for any reason, a student is unable to complete the exchange period, they must immediately notify the Exchange Coordination Office of Universidad Interamericana.
3. Any situation not covered in this call will be resolved by the Office of University Outreach (Dirección de Extensión Universitaria) of Universidad Interamericana.
4. Start of classes at Universidad Interamericana: January 2027.
